





### **CAUTION: Insurance Challenge Ahead**

Last month I submitted a pre-authorization to an insurance company. It was a traditional three unit bridge replacing a tooth that had been lost a number of years ago. The adult patient had minor orthodontics to correct some crowded lowers and then later she was to complete the bridge on the anterior maxillary. There was no "pre-existing" clause for this care.

We discussed a future partial denture at a later date. This was not submitted as part of the insurance pre-estimate. Within a short time my office received a denial for the bridge stating that United HealthCare would not pay for a fixed restoration when a removable would do. My patient did not wish to replace her lateral with a partial when she had ortho. I don't blame her and wrote to the insurance company stressing the circumstances.

The company replied that again they would PREFER to do a removable, but if we insisted they would pay for the ABUTMENTS but not the pontic and that there would be a denial for future major prosthodontic care in that arch for five years. Therefore, if a partial was pending, my patient would be ineligible.

I shared this concern with SCDA who said that the patient should talk with the company's resource office and express displeasure on the policy. Since then, I have received three more similar rejections or "changes" to other treatment plans. You may see some of these as well.

I believe that this is a strategy to contain costs and control treatment options. FYI, the applied treatment plans were standard requests that received much unexpected exclusions from the insurance company.

### Malcolm in the Middle, Service from "Heart 'N Soul"

One of my buddies, Dr. Malcolm Gordon, has trouble being still. Actually, I think he has a fear of "rusting out" and therefore always has something going on. 






# President's Message

Over the past few weeks, there were a number of things going on in the state legislature and at the S. C. Department of Health and Human Services which are very likely to have profound effects on the future of the Medicaid programs and access to dental care in South Carolina. First of all, funding for the adult Medicaid program has been completely eliminated from the current budget. Second, the legislature removed the provision in the law which prevented the director of DHHS from being able to cut Medicaid provider reimbursement rates. Since this action was taken, the new director has made an across the board cut of 3% which will take effect as of April 1st and there are rumors that further reductions may occur over the summer.

We are all keenly aware of the huge budget short falls which our legislators and state agency directors have to grapple with in these difficult financial times. As our lobbyist Richard Davis commented at the recent leadership seminar, 'It's like the bank robber who was asked why he robbed the bank. His reply was, 'that's where the money is'. Richard followed this quip with the point that when you are trying to reduce a state budget deficit the bulk of the money is in education and health care. So here is the difficult dilemma with which we all have to deal.

After the aforementioned developments, your SCDA arranged a meeting with Governor Haley's new DHHS director, Mr. Tony Keck, in an effort to make him aware of our deep concerns about how these additional cuts and the elimination of most of the adult Medicaid program will negatively impact the current excellent access to care in our state. Those of us who attended that meeting pointed out to Mr. Keck that the dental Medicaid budget has already been reduced by more than \$27,000,000 between reduced payouts made since DentaQuest began administering the program and elimination of adult Medicaid. It was made clear that elimination of adult Medicaid does not save any money, but only shifts the cost to the emergency

room and in fact will cost the department a great deal more. We also highlighted the fact that South Carolina's Medicaid and other access to dental care programs recently received the number one rating in the entire country on a

report card issued by the Pugh Foundation and that continuing loss of adequate funding will rapidly destroy or certainly significantly reduce the excellent programs which we now have in place. We also pointed out that it has taken many years and much hard work from SCDA members, in partnership with a number of other state and private agencies, to arrive at our current high level of success. Finally, we expressed our fear that if funding reduction continues to result in providers dropping out of the program, this critical resource would be

lost. If this continues we may never be able to regain our ability to provide good access to care.

Mr. Keck appeared to be genuinely interested in hearing what we had to present to him and receptive to many of our comments and suggestions. He stated that he is aware of the excellent dental Medicaid programs which we have in place and that he does feel that this is overall one area where the state's health care dollars are being well spent. He pointed out that the decision to eliminate adult Medicaid was made under the previous DHHS director and gave the impression that in light of some of the information which we provided he would likely be in favor of trying to have it re-implemented as soon as possible. Generally, Mr. Keck gave the impression that he has a very positive impression of the dental Medicaid program and that he is willing to work with us to insure that access to dental care programs in South Carolina remain strong. At present the director's words indicate that he understands the situation and the key problems and that he is willing to work with us in helping to find reasonable solutions. As we all know, Time will tell. We will keep you posted.


# **Dr. Jablon Appointed to MUSC Board of Trustees**By Phil Smith

Dr. Jablon was notified by Governor Haley's office during the last weekend in March. In a phone conversation, Dr. and Mrs. Jablon expressed excitement and gratitude for the appointment.

Harold and Irene Jablon have been active supporters of the MUSC College of Dental Medicine with donations and gift legacies exceeding one million dollars. However, it is Dr. Jablon's commitment to promoting the University that has become his passion. "I believe that there is a need to be active in the legislature in order to ensure that the State House continues to promote our doctorial programs," Dr. Jablon said.
