## Dental Lifeline Network

For many adults in South Carolina, dental care is not an option. Dental Lifeline Network • South Carolina (DLN•SC) is looking for compassionate dental professionals who can change lives. From clearing up painful dental infections and helping others eat again, volunteering with DLN• SC's Donated Dental Services (DDS) program will make a lifechanging difference. My personal journey as a DDS volunteer began in 2012. However, my preparation for the journey began in the early 1980's.

As a teenager, I was tortured by two parents that had the audacity to send me to private school. They also insisted on weekly church attendance. My older brother and I instinctively knew what our parents were up to. We watched as they constructed an oppressive bubble around us. My Dad would use the proceeds of his dental practice to oppress us while our mother, an adolescent psychiatric nurse, would use her psychiatric nursing knowledge to monitor our every move. My brother and I quickly grew to respect Mom's general intuition and room search skills.

The family would meet daily to check in on the progress of the plan. The dinner table served as a dual-purpose piece of furniture; both a typical dinner table and a boardroom table. After preparing and serving the meal, my mother would transform into her role as chair of the discipline committee. This committee reported directly to my father every evening. My digestive system learned to adapt to the trauma of these evening meetings.

Let us move on to how this relates to my involvement with the DDS program. Somehow, I labored through my high school years and moved on to college. My brother and I decided to continue with the Southern Baptist theme and matriculated at Furman University. This is where the relevance to the DDS program begins. When we came home from school for the holidays, we would often have a guest. Let us just say, my mother often brought her work home with her. You see, there were certain patients that had nowhere to go during the holidays.

One in particular, "Tom," was in his 30s. I will be quite factual about these events as Tom has passed and I feel his story has a lot to offer. Tom grew up in an upper middle-class family and went to Furman University in the 1970's. I think the fact that Tom went to Furman captured a certain piece of my mother's heart. Halfway through his Furman education, he had a breakdown that resulted in a schizophrenic diagnosis. His illness caused much damage to his relationship with his family and as a result, he was not allowed to return to his family home in upstate South Carolina. My mother opened our dinner table to Tom, and he became a frequent flyer at our house, especially during holidays. Tom was highly intelligent with interests in philosophy, politics, and golf. Tom's relationship with our family inspired many discussions regarding mental health. He and a few other guests in my past are responsible for my interest in serving as a volunteer with the DDS program.

As a young dentist in the early 1990s, I donated my time after work to various clinics in my area. Most of these clinics were emergency clinics that focused on extractions. It was always frustrating not having the instrumentation and systems to provide optimal care

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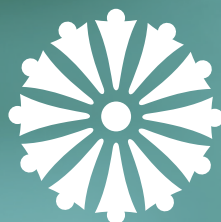
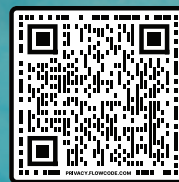


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to these patients. It was also difficult to provide quality care at the end of a long workday.

After several years, I became a bit jaded by some of the situations in which individuals were "taking advantage of the system." Fortunately, I learned about DLN • SC and its DDS program. Patients were carefully screened through a coordinator based in Columbia, allowing me to focus on taking care of the patient. The system is set-up to be seamless for volunteer dentists. Before accepting a DDS patient, a profile is provided to the dentist containing the patient's financial, social, and medical history. The volunteer dentist can then decide to treat the patient or ask for a different patient that better suits his or her skill set.

My first DDS patient, "John," needed dental services and was diagnosed with schizophrenia. For some reason, I was excited to meet him. He was and still is a very pleasant individual. With the help of a volunteer lab, I was able to restore his mouth with fixed and removable prosthetics. The process was efficient and rewarding. John has been a patient of record for the last 14 years and we have developed a great doctor-patient relationship. He is a musician, an avid reader, and quite an interesting person.

I continue to treat DDS patients and find it an extremely rewarding part of my life. I have met several interesting patients like "John" who are appreciative of the DDS program. Not only do I have the luxury of providing charitable dentistry in the privacy of my own office, but I have also been able to persuade the dental laboratories and dental implant manufacturers that I have a relationship with to join the laboratory volunteer network.

As current Chair of DLN • South Carolina's Leadership Council, I encourage those South Carolina dentists who have never considered participating to try it. Volunteering is easy. DLN handles the details, while volunteers provide care in their own offices and on their own schedules. A local coordinator, Vivian, screens patients to confirm eligibility, helps ensure patients show up to their appointments, coordinates lab work and specialty care, and serves as liaison between staff and patients. I am sure you will feel the joy of treating this special population that needs restorative dentistry.

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## Advocacy in Action

Legislative advocacy continues to be one of the main issues that causes many dentists to maintain their membership. We often hear about what AdPAC on the national level and DenPAC on the state level have accomplished by being involved in the legislative process. Passage of numerous laws over the past years has provided dentists numerous benefits. However, have you ever stopped to think about what legislative items have been prevented? Sometimes preventing legislation can be more important than passage. Please see some of the major legislative defeats AdPAC has been involved with on the national level. ### Advocacy in Action

Helping Dental Practices by Stopping or Minimizing Over-regulation by the Federal Government

## ADA Advocates for Dental Practices

**THE LAWS AND REGULATIONS THAT GOVERN DENTAL PRACTICES CAN BE COSTLY AND TIME-CONSUMING. HERE ARE WAYS THE ADA HELPS YOUR PRACTICE WHEN IT PREVENTS INEFFECTIVE POLICIES AND LAWS FROM GOING INTO EFFECT.**

- Stopped the Red Flag Rule (2010) from being implemented (saving dentists an estimated \$500/practice). The Red Flag Rule would require dentists and other health care providers to develop and implement a written identity theft program for their practices.
- Prevented elimination of the cash method of accounting, allowing dentists to continue paying taxes on revenue they receive, versus what they bill to patients. This would potentially save thousands of dollars for the average dental practice.
- Secured concessions in a new law requiring dentists to complete 8 hours of one-time training as a condition of obtaining or renewing a DEA registration—by removing a requirement to complete training on topics outside a dentist's scope of practice (e.g., prescribing buprenorphine, etc.) and allowing relevant state-recognized training, dental school coursework, and courses taken prior to the law's passage to satisfy the requirement.
- Secured National Fire Protection Association standards that saved every dental office that uses nitrous oxide sedation up to \$50,000 in costs associated with building, monitoring, and retrofitting their gas lines.
- Prevented steep cuts to oral health training programs, which enabled residents to continue being paid during their residency period.
- Enabled dentists to continue balance billing under a law that prohibited medical providers from doing so.
- Prevented the student loan interest deduction from being eliminated (\$2,500 above the line tax credit), secured market-based interest rates and interest rate caps on federal student loans, and created income-based repayment options.
- Defeated a Medicare Part B dental benefit legislative proposal that would have been unworkable for the specialized nature of the dental care delivery system.
- Stopped the 2.3 percent tax increase on the sale of medical devices from taking effect, which would have been passed down to dentists in the form of price increases.
- Secured a favorable Department of Education rule that eliminates certain "capitalizing events" that cause a borrower's accrued, unpaid interest to become part of the principal balance of their student loan and implements reforms to the Public Service Loan Forgiveness program.
- Prevented OSHA from rushing to finalize a rule that would remove the small practice exemption from adopting more specialized infection controls (e.g., hospital grade) to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Each brings valuable and diverse experience and expertise, which are detailed in their linked profiles.

Thank you to all who came to the **MUSC dental student poster session** at the SCDA Annual Session in Greenville, SC, in August. I know that the students appreciated connecting with dentists from all over South Carolina, including many of our alumni. In addition to earning continuing education credit, I hope that if you stopped by, you were able to get to know a few of our students, discuss current dental trends, and explore some of the latest oral health research from MUSC.



Our academic program leaders and their teams are preparing for the **accreditation** cycle. Six of our accredited programs will host mock site visits this fall, in advance of 2025 accreditation. I am inspired by and grateful for the continuous improvement mindset adopted by our faculty and staff, who are dedicated to supporting student success, innovating dental education, and upholding the value of a MUSC education. We began the school year by decreasing D.M.D. degree program fees, thereby **alleviating student debt** for the second consecutive year, in addition to no increase in state tuition or fees for seven consecutive years.

**Philanthropic support** also helps mitigate student debt. During the 2024 fiscal year, we received \$3.3 million in donations. Our [Pay It Forward Scholarship Campaign](#) has grown to nearly \$5 million and the college now has \$13.3 million in endowments that provide perpetual, annual funding. Endowments are a top priority to help us build an even stronger future through student scholarships and faculty recruitment and retention. The SCDA has a long history of awarding student scholarships, for which we remain grateful.

We also configured a state-of-the-art **Innovation Laboratory**, designed to bring the production of restorations in-house. The laboratory is also a comprehensive learning center, offering our students the possibility of learning the entire digital workflow, from the initial treatment plan and design to the final restoration. I look forward to sharing more with you about this advancement in digital dentistry education.

Finally, if you plan to attend the American Dental Association's **SmileCon/House of Delegates** in New Orleans, LA, I very much look forward to seeing you.
